

OXFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (PROHIBITION OF CYCLING)
(FOOTPATH BETWEEN BEECHEY AVENUE AND EWIN CLOSE,
MARSTON) ORDER, 1973

The Council of the Administrative County of Oxford, in exercise of their powers under Sections 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, and of all other powers them enabling in that behalf, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police for the Thames Valley Constabulary in accordance with Section 84C(1) of the said Act of 1967, hereby make the following Order:-

1. No person shall ride, or cause to be ridden any pedal cycle or tricycle on that footpath in the Parish of Marston which lies between Beechey Avenue and Ewin Close.
2. The Interpretation Act, 1889, shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
3. This Order may be cited as the Oxfordshire County Council (Prohibition of Cycling) (Footpath between Beechey Avenue and Ewin Close, Marston) Order, 1973, and shall come into operation on the eighteenth day of June, 1973.
