**Copy of Instructions issued by the Local Government Board as to the
Books and Accounts which should be produced at Audit by Parish
Councils and their Officers.**

The following Books, &c., should be produced at Audit:—

1. Minute Book.
2. The Book containing the entries of the moneys received and paid by the Parish Council during the year ended on the 31st of March.
3. The Bank Pass Book, or Treasurer's Account.
4. Vouchers for all payments, and also all cheques cashed by the Treasurer during the year.
5. A Cash Book, or other personal cash account of any officer who may have received and paid any money on behalf of the Parish Council during the year.
6. Any other books, such as receipt check books or rentals, documents, agreements or contracts relating to receipts or payments by or on behalf of the Parish Council.
7. A Financial Statement of Receipts and Payments in duplicate in the form prescribed by the Local Government Board. One of the duplicates must bear a "District Audit" stamp of the proper value. No other description of stamp can be accepted.
8. The Financial Statement for the previous year.

All Accounts should be made up and balanced to the 31st of March, and must be strictly confined to recording the transactions up to that date.

In any case where there was no balance in hand at the commencement of the year to which this notice relates, and where either the Parish Council had no receipts and payments during the year, or the only item of account would be in respect of the cost of the Audit Stamp upon the Financial Statement of the preceding year, attendance will be dispensed with on condition that a Certificate (which may be in the form of a letter) stating the facts and signed by the Chairman of the Parish Council is sent to the District Auditor prior to the day fixed for the Audit. In such cases the Notice of Audit need not be published.

AUDIT STAMP DUTY.

(Extract from Schedule to the Audit Stamp Duty (Local Authorities) Order, 1921, dated December 14th, 1921.)

SCALE OF STAMP DUTIES PAYABLE BY LOCAL AUTHORITIES.

For the purpose of this Schedule, the net expenditure on which stamp duty is payable shall be calculated by deducting from the expenditure comprised in the financial statement of the local authority, as audited and allowed by the district auditor, such of the following items as may be included in the expenditure so audited and allowed:—

- (1) Any sum paid in pursuance of a precept.
- (2) Any grant paid to another local authority in conformity with a statutory requirement or direction of a Government Department.
- (3) Any repayment of loan made out of money re-borrowed, or out of funds which will be replaced by money re-borrowed.
- (4) One-half of any expenditure (exclusive of any repayment of loan to which paragraph (3) of this Schedule extends) which may have been met by loan during the financial period to which the financial statement relates.
- (5) Any payment into the Motor Tax Account of sums payable into the Exchequer by virtue of the Roads Act, 1920.
