Oxfordshire County Council

BYELAW for the good rule and government of the County of Oxford and for the prevention of nuisances, made by the Council of the Administrative County of Oxford in pursuance of Section 249 of the Local Government Act, 1933, at a meeting of the Council held on the 22nd day of July, 1966.

 $Application\ of\ Byelaw.$ This byelaw shall apply throughout the urban and rural districts in the County of Oxford.

I. No person shall without lawful authority drive or place a vehicle, or cause a vehicle to be driven or placed, upon any road margin to which this byelaw applies, in such a manner as to injure or to be likely to injure, any turf or any tree, shrub or plant growing thereon.

Interpretation and extent of the byelaw.

- 2. This byelaw applies to any road margin which is:
 - (i) in or beside a public road other than a trunk road vested in the Minister of Transport;
 - (ii) laid or sown with grass or planted with trees, shrubs or plants, and maintained constantly in good order for ornamental purposes; and
 - (iii) indicated to be a margin to which this byelaw applies by means of notices conspicuously displayed on or near the said margin by the County Council of the Administrative County of Oxford.
- 3. Any person offending against this byelaw shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding $f_{.5}$.

THE COUNTY OF OXFORD (VARIOUS ROADS, MARSTON, LITTLEMORE, SANDFORD-ON-THAMES) (WEIGHT RESTRICTION) ORDER, 1969.

The Council of the Administrative County of Oxford in exercise of their powers under Section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended

by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1668, and of all other powers them enabling

in that behalf HEREBY MAKE the following Order: -

Save as provided in Article 2 of this Order, no person shall cause any vehicle the unladen weight of which exceeds tons, to proceed in any of the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order.

- 2. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall apply so as to prevent any persons from causing any vehicle to proceed in any of the lengths of roads referred to in that Article, if the vehicle is being used:
 - for Police, Fire Brigade, or Ambulance purposes;

for the conveyance of persons, goods or merchandise to or from any premises situated on or adjacent to that length of road;

for the purposes of agriculture in connection with land adjacent

to that length of road or for the conveyance of haulage of timber felled upon that land;

(d) in connection with any building operation or demolition in or adjacent to that length of road, the removal of any obstruction to traffic in that length of road, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of that length of road, or the laying, erection, alternation or repair in or adjacent to that length of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act, 1878;

in the course of military training operations; or

as a public service vehicle, stage carriage, express carriage, or contract carriage.

- This Order shall come into operation on the 14th day of July, 1969, and may be cited as "The County of Oxford (Various Roads, Marston, Littlemore and Sandford-on-Thames) (Weight Restriction) Order, 1969."

Rural District of Bullingdon in the County of Oxford

Lengths or road in the Parish of:

Marston

Those roads which lie to the south of the London-Fishguard trunk road (A.40), but excluding any length of the said London - Fishguard trunk road (A.40).

Littlemore

All the roads, but excluding any length of the Oxford City ring - road (A.4142) and the south of Oxford - West of Maidenhead trunk road (A.423) and any length of road in that part of the parish which is detached and adjacent to the parish of Garsingtion.

Sandford-on-Thames

Those roads which lie to the west of the South of Oxford - West of Maidenhead trunk road (A.423), but excluding any length of the said trunk road A.423.







OXFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (MARSH LANE JUNCTION) (CLEARWAY) ORDER, 1974

The Council of the Administrative County of Oxford in exercise of their powers under Section 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, and of all other powers them enabling in that behalf and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police for the Thames Valley Constabulary in accordance with Section 84C(1) of the said Act of 1967, hereby make the following Order:-

- 1. Save as provided in Article 2 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden cause or permit any vehicle to wait in those lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this Order (which lengths of road are hereinafter referred to as "the restricted roads").
- 2. Nothing in Article 1 of this Order shall apply:
 - (a) so as to prevent a vehicle waiting in the restricted roads for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle, if it cannot be used for such purpose without waiting in those roads, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction or potential obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the roads, or the erection, laying, placing, maintenance, testing, alteration, repair or removal of any structure, works or apparatus in, on, under, or over the roads;
 - (b) to a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes;
 - (c) to a vehicle being used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in section 87 of the Post Office Act, 1953;
 - (d) so as to prevent a vehicle being used by or on behalf of a local authority from waiting in the restricted roads for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle, if it cannot be used for such purpose without waiting in those roads to be used for the purpose of the collection of household refuse from, or the clearing cesspools at, premises situated on or adjacent to the roads;
 - (e) to a vehicle waiting in the restricted roads while any gate or other barrier at the entrance to premises to which the vehicle requires access or from which it has emerged is opened or closed, if it is not reasonably practicable for the vehicle to wait otherwise than on the roads while such gate or barrier is being opened or closed;
 - (f) to a vehicle waiting in any case where the person in control of the vehicle is required by law to stop, or is obliged to do so in order to avoid an accident, or is prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside his control.

SCHEDULE

Roads in the Parish of Marston in the County of Oxford

- 1. That length of the Marston Flyover and Marsh Lane which extends from its junction with the road to Elsfield and Woodeaton lying on the northern side of the London-Fishguard Trunk Road (A.40) (Oxford Northern By-Pass) for a distance of 430 metres in a generally southerly direction;
- 2. That length of the road to Elsfield and Woodeaton lying on the north-eastern side of the London-Fishguard Trunk Road (A.40) which extends for a distance of 68 metres north-east of its junction with the road specified in paragraph 1 of this Schedule;
- 3. That length of the Marston Slip Road West and Marsh Lane which extends from its junction with the road specified in paragraph 1 of this Schedule to its junction with Elsfield Road;
- 4. Elsfield Road, from its junction with the road specified in paragraph 3 of this Schedule for a distance of 64 metres west; and
- 5. The road which lies between and connects the roads specified in paragraphs 1 and 3 of this Schedule.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on the 7th February, 1974, the Oxfordshire County Council made the above-named Order under Section 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, the effect of which is that you will not be allowed to leave your vehicle at any time in that length of Boults Lane in the Parish of Marston which extends from its junction with Oxford Road for a distance of 96 metres (106 yards) east. The normal exceptions (i.e. including picking-up and setting down passengers, loading and unloading) will apply.

A copy of the Order, which will come into effect on the 18th February, 1974, and of the relevant plan, may be inspected at County Hall, New Road, Oxford, between the hours of 9.30 a.m. and 12.45 p.m. and 2.15 p.m. and 4.00 p.m. every weekday except Saturday.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or of any instrument made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within six weeks of the 7th February, 1974, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

OXFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (ELSFIELD ROAD AND OXFORD ROAD, MARSTON) (PROHIBITION OF MOTOR VEHICLES) ORDER 1989

The Oxfordshire County Council (hereinafter referred to as "The Council") in exercise of their powers under Sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984, hereby make the following Order:—

1. In this Order:

"motor vehicle" means a mechanically propelled vehicle intended or adapted for use on roads.

"prohibited roads" means the lengths of road comprised in Oxford Road between its junction with Marston Ferry Link Road and its junction with Elsfield Road, and Elsfield Road between its junction with Oxford Road and its junction with Marsh Lane.

- 2. Save as provided in Article 3 of this order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Officer in uniform, cause or permit any motor vehicle, to proceed in the prohibited roads.
- 3. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall apply so as to prevent any person from causing any vehicle to proceed in the prohibited roads if the vehicle is being used:-
 - (a) for or in connection with the conveyance of persons or goods to or from any premises situated on or adjacent to the restricted roads or accessible only from those roads;
 - (b) for the purposes of agriculture on any land adjacent to the restricted roads or for or in connection with the conveyance or haulage of timber felled upon such land;
 - (c) in connection with the carrying out on, or on premises situated on or adjacent to, the restricted roads, or accessible only from those roads, of any of the following operations, namely:-
 - (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) the removal of obstructions to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the roads;
 - (iv) the laying erection, alteration or repair in, or on land adjacent to, the roads of any sewer, or any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of water, gas or electricity, or any telecommunications apparatus as defined in Schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984.

- (d) for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes:
- (e) to proceed to or from any premises which are situated on or adjacent to the restricted roads, or accessible only from those roads, and at which the vehicle is to be, or had been, garaged, serviced or repaired;
- (f) in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties; or
- (g) in connection with the conveyance of goods for sale from the vehicle on restricted roads.
- 4. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall have effect so as to prevent such access as may reasonably be required for vehicles of any class or description to premises or land situated adjacent to the said roads or to premises or land accessible for vehicles of that class or description from and only from these roads.
- 5. The Oxfordshire County Council (Elsfield Road and Oxford Road, Marston) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1975 is hereby revoked.
- 6. This Order may be cited as the Oxfordshire County Council (Elsfield Road and Oxford Road, Marston)(Prohibition of Motor Vehicles) Order 1989 and shall come into operation on the 28 April 1989.
