#### Election of Chairman and Vice - chairman

Mr. C. Haynes and Mrs. C. Stone were elected Chairman and Vice-chairman respectively.

#### Minutes

The Minutes of the Meeting held on 2 April 2002 were confirmed and signed.

#### North East Area Committee

Mrs. Stone reported that there was nothing of significance discussed at the meeting. There were no planning applications affecting the Parish.

#### Correspondence

An invitation to send a representative to the Oxfordshire Service of Thanksgiving on 17 May 2002 was received, Mrs. Stone would attend.

An invitation to send a representative to the reception following the Election to the Mayoralty on 13 May 2002 was received. The Chairman would attend.

An invitation to send a representative to the Parish Records presentation at the Oxfordshire Record Office was received. Mr. Bartleet would attend.

It was suggested that Mr. Alun Jones should be asked to investigate what records of the past of the Parish existed.

#### Other Matters

An invitation to send a representative to a County Council meeting with Local Councils to discuss the Draft County Structure Plan was noted.

The County Council invited the Council's views on the present coach parking arrangements in St. Giles. They were considered to be dangerous and unsightly. The Clerk would respond accordingly.

The Clerk would request a copy of the Draft Local Plan and make representations on the proposal to hold further consultations into the HAMATS Report. The earlier consultations were held in a single and inconvenient location and were held in the start of the holiday season when resident's minds were otherwise engaged planning or taking holidays. Also the HAMATS proposals were considered in isolation from the arrangements for the JRII Extension.

A possible name for the White Hart Development was discussed, that preferred being White Hart Lee. Other possibilities would be invited from Marston Times readers.

The Clerk explained the new arrangements for the audit of the Council's accounts commencing 1 April 2001. These require a suitable member of the public, not necessarily qualified in a form of accountancy, to carry out a "light touch" review on an ongoing basis of the Council's accounting. A reasonable payment could be made for the service. The person must be independent of the Council or its employees. Candidates would be invited to apply via the Marston Times.

#### **Recreation Ground**

Mrs. D. Dance, Secretary of the Oxford Preservation Trust attended to discuss the formal agreement the Trust wished to have for the Council's use of the Mill Lane land for recreation. The terms offered were generally acceptable subject to a sound fence being provided before the agreement was signed. Previous front fences had been of a temporary nature and vandalised. The conclusion was that iron railings of parkland design should be provided and the cost shared. The Clerk would obtain a quotation.

Quotations for recreation ground maintenance were received and the Clerk was asked to contact the Clerk to Islip Parish Council who had also been trawling for quotations for a similar service.

The Chairman reported on the meeting with Marston Saints F.C. about the new pavilion. As the Clerk had recently spoken to a different person at the Football Foundation who said that outline planning consent would be adequate for the submission of a grant application he was to submit the planning application. There was, therefore, no decision to be taken. Progress on the acquisition of the extra land was reported and as members of the Club had appropriate equipment and expertise to prepare it for play the offer would be discussed further.

Mr. D. Ward who rented the spare allotment land at the end of Mill Lane requested permission to lay a narrow carpet of bark chippings to enable horse jump training to be carried out. It was permitted on acceptance of his undertaking to remove them in due course.

St Anthony's Church asked permission to hold a Parish (Church) picnic on the Boults Lane Recreation Ground on 14 or 28 July 2002. Subject to consultation with Marston Saints F.C. it was agreed.

The Clerk would arrange painting of the amusements.

#### Highways

Concern continued about parking arrangements for contractors on the White Hart Site. Mr. Coats had received no reply to his letter seeking cooperation from the developer (written on City Council Members notepaper) and the County Council turned down the request for parking control outside the shop. The Clerk would write again and sight the precedent at Sandhills Estate.

The Clerk confirmed that without the City Council legislating there could be no control of pavement parking unless it was such that the police could act for obstruction.

#### **Burial Ground**

It was decided to accept Mr. D. Ward's quotations as follows:

To lay a 100mm polythene surface water drain down the centre of the Burial Ground Extension to the ditch for £1,035

For the construction of the wall to convey to the site and remove, as needed, a cement mixer and generator for the time required and to take delivery of the materials at Hill View Farm and convey them to site, on demand for the sum of £100.

Two replies to the question asked of local masons as to the soundness of erection procedures had been received. Both quoted standards set by the National Association of Memorial Masons. The Clerk had forwarded them to the Health and Safety Executive for comment.

#### Other Item

Mr. Coats, although nor currently a member of the City Council, wished to continue with setting up a web site that would give the Parish Council the opportunity to have its minutes etc available to web users. It was decided to invite him to the next Council meeting.
