The Clerk was asked to obtain quotations for the following:

For the plan, supply and erection, with the required safety surfaces, of the following equipment on the Mortimer Hall Recreation Ground. The part nos. are from the Wicksteed Catalogue.

6040-008 10' 2 seat swing with tyre seats, one each 5901-021 and 5901-011, and anti-wrap chains

6070-041 Basket ball/Five aside goal

6070-811 Sputnik

6060-030 Fish

5091-020 Cradle seat provide and fit only to replace old pattern and quote separately for safety surface to this area

Swings adjacent to the above provide safety surface

Anti-dog fencing to amusement area.

The final consent required for the grant of a new lease to the Mortimer Hall Committee had been received and the Clerk had instructed the Solicitors to proceed with the lease.

Concern was expressed at the noise levels arising from the football activities of Marston Saints F.C. who now had matches almost every Saturday and Sunday mornings and afternoons in addition to training during the week. Further concern was expressed at the length of time the bar was open and the amount of litter left after matches. The Clerk was asked to write to the Club to ask for its proposals to address these matters.

# **Highways**

The Clerk would write to the City Council to request bollards on the grassed areas on the corners of Raymund Road and The Link to prevent cars parking thereon.

Replacement of the road signs for Raymund and Elsfield Roads still awaited.

Many of the recent replacements of setts had failed within a day or two and were again dangerous. The Clerk would draw attention of the Highway Engineer to this and ask that a long-term solution be planned.

Mr Bartleet drew attention to accident statistics, recently published, showing 24 injury accidents at the Marsh Lane/A40 west slip road between 1994 and 1999 and 16 at Headley Way/Marston Road/Marsh Lane junction in the same period.

The need for a footpath between the end of that in Marsh Lane and that in Elsfield Road was again raised. Mr. Bartleet would raise this again.

# **Burial Ground**

Quotations in the sum of £1440 from D. Ward were accepted for ground works to the Burial Ground Extension subject to minor amendment for omitted items.

The specification for the new railings was circulated.
