BAPTISES 9TH FER 1812

-Born at Stonesfield, Oxfordshire in 1812. (Act to 1841) census aged 30, he was living in Stonesfiel and employed as a gardener when his son Arthur was born in 1841. Arthur was 1 month old at the census date. Emanuel could have been employed as a gardener at Blenhiem Palace, Woodstock. The village of Stonesfield is just outside and to the north of Blenhiem Palace Est The name of Stonesfield is derived from the stone used for roofing tiles quarried there which is on the southe side of the Cotswold Hills.

He lived in Jericho Street, Oxford on the 24th December 1865 when his son Arthur (aged 24) married Jemima. He worked as a groom probably for Morrells Brewery (hordwarm wagons) based in Jericho. Also Arthur probably worked there as well.

-Born in Stonesfield, Oxfordshire on the 7th of May 1841 -At the 1851 census, Arthur (aged 10) was a pupil at a school in Cowley, Oxford, and probably lived at 198 Lit Brewery Street, St. Clements, Oxford with his parents. At the 1861 census (aged 20) he was staying in Headington Oxford at his girl friends house (No. 166 at the west er of the village) where he was a visitor. He married Jemin (aged 19) on the 24th December 1865. She could not read nor write and worked as a laundress. At the 1871 census (aged 30) and apparently still_living in St. Clements, he and his wife Jemima worked as Brewers Servants and had two sons - Arthur E. (aged 4) and Charles Henry (aged 3) who became Grandfather to Allan george Webb. At the 1881 census (aged 40) he lived in Marston Road, Headington with his wife (Jemima) and five children -Arthur E. (aged 14) - Charles Henry (aged 13) - Bessie (aged 9) - Ellen A. (aged 7) and Herbert W. (aged 2). Ada J. was not born until after the census in 1881.

Charles Henry (1867-1917) Grandfather to Allan George (1926-)

-Born in St. Clements, Oxford at 198, Little Brewery Street, in 1867. Marker America [Some 1865] Oct. 30 markers. At the 1871 census he lived as above aged 4 At the 1881 census he was at school aged 14 At the 1891 census - not found At the 1901 census Charles Henry (aged 34) had already married Amelia Ann (aged 36) and lived at 47 Oxford road, Old Marston with their sons - Charles Henry (aged 7) - Eugene Arthur (aged 5) - George Albert (aged 2) - and william Clemenso (aged 1 month). Their two daughters were worked as a consend.

Worked as a general gardener in a garden nursery and served in the Royal Garrison Artillary during the Great War. — Died of wounds on the 6th February 1917 and is buried in Lijssenthoek Military Cemetery near Poperinghe, Belgium. (aged 50)

Eugene Arthur Webb (1896-1973) Father to Allan George (1926-) Born in Old Marston, Oxford on the 18th February 1896. At the 1901 census he was at school in Old Marston (aged 5).

Started work as a plumbers apprentice on leaving school. Then joined the Great Western Railway and moved to Neath, South Wales towards the end of the Great War. He lived in lodgings next door to Carey (Caroline) Edwards and her parents and he married Carey (who was better known as "FLOSSY") on the Carey (who was better known as is boys: Raymond Charles-31st August 1918. They had six boys: Raymond Charles-Gordon - Allan George - Gerald Gwyn - Haydn John - and Clive before moving back to Oxford in 1940. He died on the 19th October 1973 and his ashes are buried with "Flossy" in St. Nicholas Church yard Old Marston next to the school he attended as a boy.

1901 census :- Arthur E. (Eugene) Webb was in fact Eugene Arthur Webb but was known as Arthur. Also as Dick.
